LLC 750, Section 01 Survey Research

This course will emphasize the substantive and conceptual development of survey questions that focus on social inequality in the Baltimore Metropolitan Area. Students will be introduced to notions of income and wealth inequality, educational disparities, and health inequalities and how to measure them with survey methods. The course will constitute the practicum in survey research, with both in-class instruction in survey methodology and out-of-class fieldwork in which students actually construct survey questions.
