LLC 750 Introduction to Decolonial/Coloniality Studies with Professor Tanya Saunders
 This course offers a very brief introduction to the interrelated fields of Decolonial Studies and Coloniality Studies. In this seminar style course, we will read an article, an essay or an excerpt of a key essay, by key theorists in these fields, and meet to have a conversation about the larger philosophical interventions that they make in Western Thought. Some of the scholars we will read include: Sylvia Wynter, Walker Mignolo, Yuderks Espinosa Minoso, Denise Ferreira da Silva, Katherin McKittrick, Rinaldo Walcott and others writing from the Americas. This is a very “intro” course that will introduce you to their ideas so that when you encounter them later in another course, you will be ready to gain a deeper understanding of their intellectual work.
